- [The Deaf Hotline](#) provides 24/7 support, crisis advocacy, and referrals to Deaf and Hard of Hearing survivors and their loved ones via phone (855.812.1001) and online chat.
- [Child Helpline International](#) provides a directory of international child abuse hotlines. These agencies provide services such as counseling, referrals, emotional support, and more.

- [The Sanctuary for Families COVID-19 Safety Plan from Survivors, for Survivors](#) offers practical strategies to reduce the risk of harm in an abusive situation during the pandemic. This safety plan was reviewed by survivors and clinicians.
- [The Safety Net technology safety survivor's guide](#) is a toolkit for survivors of abuse that helps maintain privacy and confidentiality online and across multiple devices.
- [The DocuSAFE documentation and evidence collection app](#) is a free app that allows abuse survivors to collect, store, and share evidence of abuse.

## Online Support Groups



- [After Silence](#) provides online sexual violence support forums for survivors of molestation, child sexual abuse, intimate partner sexual violence, incest, and more in English and Spanish.
- [Pandora's Aquarium](#) provides online sexual violence support groups. They also provide a directory of sexual violence resources for survivors in Asia & India, Canada, Europe, the US, Australia, New Zealand, Africa, South America, and Mexico.
- [Domestic Shelters](#) hosts a safe and private Facebook support group for sharing meaningful dialogue and gaining helpful insight. They also generally provide comprehensive information on U.S. and Canadian domestic violence resources and services [on their website](#).
- [Fort Refuge](#) is an online community of abuse survivors, providing forums on a range of topics for victims and survivors of abuse.
- [1 in 6](#) is an organization for male survivors of abuse, providing a 24/7 helpline, online support groups each weekday, and additional information and resources.
- [HAVOCA](#), or Help for Adult Survivors of Child Abuse offers a private online chat forum for survivors.
- [isurvive](#) is an online support group for child abuse survivors - for all forms of abuse. They offer various online forums for survivors of ritualized abuse, child sexual abuse, male survivors, survivors with PTSD, and more.

## Pets

- [Purple Leash Project](#) is a partnership between Purina & RedRover that is working to create more pet-friendly domestic violence shelters across the US (less than 20% accept pets currently, and many victims delay leaving because they don't want to leave their pets behind).
- [RedRover's](#) mission is to bring people and pets from crisis to care. In addition to helping victims of domestic violence through the Purple Leash Project, they also help those impacted by natural disasters.
- [Safe Place for Pets](#) is also run by RedRover and helps domestic violence victims find pet-friendly shelters and other options so they can seek help immediately.
